



BSIR Snapshot Survey 2016 Out of Hours Intervention for Haemorrhage

We need your help

The BSIR Registries and Audit Committee will be undertaking a snapshot survey of out-of-hours intervention for haemorrhage control in the first week of October 2016.

This survey aims to assess the workload, staffing, logistical and networking arrangements for patients undergoing radiological intervention for haemorrhage in the periods out-of-hours for a single week beginning Monday 3rd October 2016. We also aim to collect some qualitative data on patients who need IR for haemorrhage but who do not receive it.

We hope to use this data to inform workforce, training and service design negotiations with the GMC, commissioners and other stakeholders.

The survey will be the first of what we plan as an annual programme of snapshot surveys in the autumn. The results will be analysed for rapid presentation at the Annual Scientific Meeting in November each year.

We understand that you receive a number of requests to complete survey data. We aim to reduce this and concentrate on a smaller number of surveys, by which we hope to improve participation and data quality.

For this survey we are asking that you complete a survey return for every patient you treat out-of-hours for haemorrhage control for a single week in October.

We will be sending out further details and definitions (eg. for the purposes of the survey: what constitutes out-of-hours; what intervention for haemorrhage means and the exact dates) closer to the time of the survey.

We will be advertising the audit extensively over the period running up to and during this week. The audit dataset is simple (18 questions) and should take at most 2 minutes to complete.
