

BSIR VITALS 2026 Abstract Submission Information

Opportunity:

If you are a Consultant, Trainee, or Allied Health Professional, working or interested in the field of Vascular IR, you have the opportunity to submit an abstract for the BSIR VITALS 2026 Meeting.

If your submitted abstract is accepted, you will be eligible for one of the awards below. **Please note, only one author (the corresponding author) for accepted abstracts will receive the award.**

- Consultant: Discounted Registration to VITALS 2026 (registration includes dinner and overnight accommodation)
- Trainee: Free registration to VITALS 2026, including dinner and overnight accommodation.
- Allied Health Professional: Free registration to VITALS 2026, including dinner and overnight accommodation.
- Poster presentation in person at VITALS 2026.

Winners will be invited to present their posters at the VITALS 2026 meeting. One Consultant, one Trainee and one Allied Health Professional will also receive an award for the best abstract in their category.

Eligibility:

To submit an abstract for VITALS 2026, you **must** be either a consultant, trainee, or allied health professional, with the content of your abstract relating to the field of Vascular Interventional Radiology. Trainees and allied health professionals **must** have a consultant co-author on all submissions. Multiple submissions can be made, however only one submission will be selected for an award.

Important notes:

- Neither the authors nor the submitting centre(s) must be identified by name within the submission, in order to allow unbiased anonymous review.
- Please adhere to the word count (250 words), do not attempt to exceed it by omitting spaces or adding underscores.
- Non-anonymous abstracts or abstracts exceeding the word count will likely be disqualified.

Abstract Submission:

Abstracts can be submitted as either Scientific or Educational posters. **One named author must attend VITALS 2026 in person, only that person will receive the free registration.** For submissions made by trainees or allied health professionals, this person cannot be a consultant.

Accepted posters are to be printed and brought to the meeting in person. Posters are to be printed in size A0, portrait.

Abstract Scoring:

Abstracts will be scored on the following:

- Quality of scientific methods and conclusion.
- Clinical relevance to Interventional Oncology.
- Study Design (randomised controlled trials will score higher than prospective trials or retrospective case series).
- Innovation and creativity.

Please submit all audit, management and service reviews as scientific submissions.

Please identify whether patient consent and institutional review board approval were granted. If no statement is made, it will be assumed that this has not been sought or given. Off-label use of any device must be declared.

Submission Deadline: Sunday 25th January 2026 @ Midnight.
